A new nuclear arms race is upon us

One of the more comforting developments of modern times has been the decline in nuclear-arms stocks and the threat they constitute. Sanity among the superpowers has been evident for three decades – ever since Mikhail Gorbachev took the evil out of his empire and reached arms agreements with Ronald Reagan.

But the run of prudent oversight is drawing to a close. U.S. President Donald Trump, as one magazine headline [puts it](#), is Making America Nuclear Again. Overshadowed by all the sabre-rattling with North Korea are pivotal changes he is bringing to nuclear-weapons policy.

Under the patronage of Her Honour, the Honourable Lois E. Mitchell, CM, AOE, LLD, Lieutenant Governor of Alberta, the Calgary Peace Prize recognizes outstanding individuals from the global community who work towards making the world a more just, safer and less violent place.

For the first time in decades, it's hard to ignore the threat of nuclear war. But as long as you're far from the blast, you're safe, right? Wrong. In this sobering talk, atmospheric scientist Brian Toon explains how even a small nuclear war could destroy all life on earth -- and what we can do to prevent it. A professor in the Department of Atmospheric and Oceanic Sciences at the University of Colorado-Boulder, Brian Toon investigates the causes of the ozone hole, how volcanic eruptions alter the climate, how ancient Mars had flowing rivers, and the environmental impacts of nuclear war. He contributed to the U.N.'s Nobel Peace Prize for climate change and holds numerous scientific awards, including two NASA medals for Exceptional Scientific Achievement. He is an avid woodworker. This talk was given at a TEDx event using the TED conference format but independently organized by a local community.

PETITION TO THE HOUSE OF COMMONS IN PARLIAMENT ASSEMBLED

- Nuclear Weapons are the only weapons of mass destruction not yet prohibited by international agreement

We, the undersigned, **residents of Canada**, call upon the **Government of Canada** to sign and ratify the United Nations Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons.

Mark Ayyash is an Assistant Professor of Sociology and Director of the John de Chastelain Peace Studies Initiative at Mount Royal University. He teaches and writes in the areas of social and political theory, the study of violence, decolonial movements, as well as culture and politics in the Middle East, particularly focusing on the Palestinian-Israeli struggle. He has published several academic articles in journals such as the *European Journal of Social Theory* and *Interventions: International Journal of Postcolonial Studies*. His co-edited book with Dr. Ratiba Hadj-Moussa titled *Protests and Generations: Legacies and Emergences in the Middle East, North Africa and the Mediterranean* (Brill) was published in 2017. In his capacity as Director of Peace Studies, Mark organizes a Lecture Series, the Annual Calgary Peace Prize Ceremony, and has recently developed a Minor in Peace and Conflict Studies.

Refusing to be Enemies, presents the voices of more than 100 practitioners and theorists of nonviolence, with the vast majority being either Palestinian or Israeli. They reflect on their own involvement in nonviolent resistance and speak about the nonviolent strategies and tactics employed by Palestinian and Israeli organizations, both separately and in joint initiatives. The book considers the obstacles encountered by nonviolent organizations and includes examples of effective nonviolent campaigns. Additionally, it explores ways in which a more effective nonviolent movement may be built.

“Don’t Even Think About It: Why our Brains are Wired to Ignore Climate Change” by George Marshall

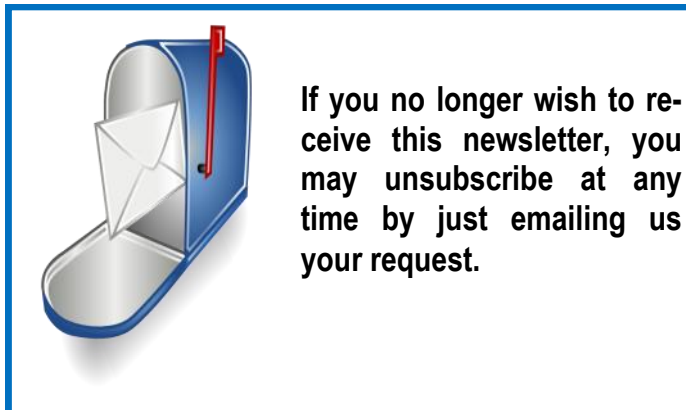
