

Canada and the Humanitarian Movement to Abolish Nuclear Weapons

A growing number of states are joining a new movement, emphasizing humanitarian law, to create a legally binding instrument to ban nuclear weapons. Canadian policy is incoherent. On one hand Canada supports NATO doctrine, which continues to maintain that nuclear weapons provide the "supreme guarantee" of safety. On the other hand, Canada supports the Nuclear Non-proliferation Treaty, which includes important nuclear disarmament obligations.

The humanitarian movement to eliminate nuclear weapons fits in with long-held Canadian values. Canada should join those states calling for comprehensive negotiations to start now, leading to a legal framework for the verified, irreversible, and enforceable elimination of nuclear weapons.
